To issue the I-20 Certificate of Eligibility students must:

- 1) Be accepted to University of Dallas as a degree-seeking student.
- 2) Submit proof of financial responsibility by completing the Confirmation of Financial Resources Form which can be found on the University's website at <http://www.udallas.edu/admiss/international.cfm>. Send this form along with required bank statement(s) from the last 12 months.

UD welcomes applications from international students wishing to pursue a four-year undergraduate degree; however, **the university is not able to offer need-based financial assistance to students who are not U.S. citizens or permanent residents of the U.S.** The International Scholarship Committee may award scholarships to students who meet all the international undergraduate admission requirements. Scholarships are awarded on a competitive basis in relation to the achievements of other applicants; SAT scores take precedence over TOEFL. Documents required as part of the international undergraduate application will determine eligibility, and no separate scholarship application is required. International students should be prepared to finance, either privately or through a sponsor, the full cost of their UD education during the entire period of study, including travel and vacations. Currently, that amount is \$36,000 for a 9-month period. **Students who would not be able to cover at least \$36,000 of their expenses are best advised not to apply for admission.** The Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) is required of applicants whose native language is not English. **Undergraduate applicants who have been educated in English-speaking countries must submit the SAT, ACT or the TOEFL/IELTS – especially for scholarship consideration.**
