The University of Dallas Recertified as a National Center of Academic Excellence in Information Assurance

The University has once again been officially Recertified as a National Center of Academic Excellence in Information Assurance by the NSA from 2009-2014. Dr. Blanke will accept the recertification award for the Center at the Colloquium for Information Systems Security Education (CISSE) meeting in Seattle WA on June 3rd. Additionally, UD's curriculum was reaccredited to mapping to CNSS 4011-4015 in November and will also be awarded at the CISSE meeting. UD's CNSS 2016 mapping is on a different schedule and expires in 2011. Thanks to everyone that has supported the UD IA Program making UD the only school in Texas and one of seven in the world to map to all 6 CNSS designations.

Dr. Franklin, who has led successful accreditation efforts in her recent deanships, brings valuable experience to the University.

"I am looking forward to leading the College in achieving accreditation by AACSB International - The Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business, the premier accrediting agency for business schools worldwide," added Dr. Franklin. "The business programs at UD have long been recognized for their quality and innovativeness. The achievement of AACSB International accreditation will provide a formal external endorsement of these programs."

Dr. Franklin has been the dean of the College of Business at the University of South Florida St. Petersburg since July 2006. She also served as dean of the School of Business at The University of Texas of the Permian Basin from 1999-2006, director of the Division of Management and Marketing at The University of Texas at San Antonio from 1998-1999, and chair of the Department of Management, Marketing, and International Business at Stephen F. Austin State University from 1994-1998.

Dr. Franklin has served in various leadership roles in academic and professional organizations. She recently completed a three-year term on the AACSB International Board of Directors, where she served as a member of the Audit Committee from 2004-2006 and chair of the AACSB Constitution and Bylaws Committee in 2006-2007. She is immediate past president of the United States Association for Small Business and Entrepreneurship and a past president of the Southwestern Business Deans' Association, the Council of Texas Business Deans, the Small Business Institute (formerly the Small Business Institute Directors' Association), the Association for Small Business & Entrepreneurship (formerly the Southwestern Small Business Institute Association), and the Southwest Academy of Management.

A Texas native, Dr. Franklin received her Ph.D. from the University of North Texas and her MBA and bachelor's degree from Stephen F. Austin State University.

Looking for participants for the 2009 DFRWS Forensic Challenge

UD IA alumni, Jim Donahue is assembling a team to compete in the 2009 DFRWS Forensic Challenge. Jim's preliminary work can be found on-line at <http://rjx2.com/dfrws/>



The scenario is as follows. In early 2009 it came to the attention of investigators that an individual with the nickname "nssal" was using a Sony Playstation3 (PS3) to make illicit images (specifically, certain images depicting Mardi Gras activities) available to other PS3 users. Investigators determined that "nssal" was connecting from an IP address in New Orleans, and they began capturing network traffic with the goal of catching "nssal" red-handed. Based on their initial surveillance, it appeared that "nssal" had advanced knowledge of Linux and digital forensics. On March 11, 2009 investigators observed "nssal" communicating with another PS3 user and exchanging unknown data. With proper legal authorization, the investigators entered the suspect's premises and found him in front of a PS3 that was running Linux. They interviewed the suspect and determined that he was a digital forensics researcher who was developing memory acquisition and analysis tools for Linux on the PS3. He denied having exchanged any information with other PS3 users. Investigators captured physical memory of the Linux system on the PS3 using tools found on the system.
