

JOB DESCRIPTION

The University of Dallas Constantin College invites applications for a full-time, tenure-track faculty position at the rank of Assistant Professor.

The Assistant Professor position includes instruction at the undergraduate and graduate levels.

The successful candidate will show demonstrable interest in teaching canonical literary texts from Homer to the present and have the philosophical, historical, and literary breadth to be successful in our curriculum. Candidates in any field of English or American Literature are encouraged to apply, but we have a particular interest in American literature or lyric poetry. The usual teaching load is 3/3 with two preparations.

Research expectations include publication and professional activity; applicants should be mindful that we value quality of scholarship over quantity.

Service responsibilities include committee work, undergraduate advising, and participation in departmental student oral examinations and various academic events that contribute to the vibrant and convivial intellectual life of our campus.

- ✓ Teaching the core curriculum Literary Tradition courses I- IV taken by all students at the University
- ✓ Teaching required English major courses in the department
- ✓ Teaching upper class electives for English majors

- ✓ Serving on yearly undergraduate oral examination panels for two of the major courses – one testing conversancy with the work of various lyric poets, and the other assessing public presentations of senior projects on various novels

- ✓ Experience teaching
- ✓ Evidence of scholarly promise

- ✓ Educational grounding that includes familiarity with and/or interest in the broader questions and texts covered by the University's core curriculum

Candidates should submit a letter of interest, a curriculum vitae detailing all academic and professional experience, three letters of recommendation, and a one-page statement of their deepest intellectual concerns.
